### **Kindle Ranch Continues Promote Nonprofit Collaboration**

Los Angeles- Kindle Ranch, a nonprofit that will begin building Southern California's first fully-accessible, green campsite, continued along the path of collaboration by hosting their third Nonprofit Collaboration Luncheon at the California Endowment Center on Monday, January 24, 2011.

The campsite will be designed and built by Kindle Ranch but utilized by nonprofit organizations throughout Southern California. While the nonprofits that use Kindle Ranch will not be responsible for the cost of the land or buildings, they are vital to the design of the facility. Each of the nonprofit partners are experts in their field and therefore will know best how to serve their populations. Those groups utilizing the campsite will include: autism, cancer, epilepsy, HIV/AIDS, multiple sclerosis, poverty and gang violence, to name a few.

FOCUS, the architecture firm selected by Kindle Ranch staff to design and build the campsite, presented to the group of nonprofit representatives. Their presentation included a background of FOCUS, the layout of the terrain and acreage of the land for the campsite and their tentative idea of the layout of the campsite. All throughout the presentation members of the group were invited to share their thoughts and suggestions and ask questions about the basic structures.

The Kindle Ranch Nonprofit Collaboration Luncheon is free of charge to all interested nonprofits. The next luncheon will be held on May 16, 2011.
