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## **Kindle Ranch Bringing Non-Profits Together with New Camp**

Los Angeles – Last spring Kindle Ranch announced a campaign to construct Kindle Ranch, a fully-accessible, green camp that will be made available to non-profit organizations serving special needs campers. Yesterday, Kindle Ranch continued along this mission by continuing to connect with nonprofit organizations around Southern California.

The campsite will be completely funded and built by Kindle Ranch, but designed and utilized by other organizations struggling to offer their communities adequate facilities. These organizations work with communities facing issues such as autism, cancer, poverty and gang violence. Kindle Ranch now has nine committed partners to this project: Dream Street Foundation, Camp Kindle, Cancer Hope Foundation, Urban Compass, OCF-OCF, Epilepsy Foundation of Greater Los Angeles, Comfort Zone Camp, National Multiple Sclerosis Society of Souther California and Kris' Camp.

Kindle Ranch hosted their second Nonprofit Collaboration luncheon at the California Endowment on Monday, September 27, 2010, for leaders of non-profits who will be involved in the planning of Kindle Ranch.

“The key to this entire project is collaboration. That is why we spent time at our second meeting learning about how other nonprofits run their programs and finding ways we can all help each other,” said Eva Payne, Founder and CEO of Kindle Ranch.
